- ✓ **Enforcing and mainstreaming** at transnational level **the results achieved** in the Med area **in promoting sustainable mobility in urban planning** by supporting modular community projects to build on, improve the visibility of, and mainstream their results through joint strategies based on synergies and networking.

- ✓ **Capitalisation event** at SUMP conference, Nicosia, May 2018
 - ✓ **Analysis of projects' results** to be finalised soon
 - ✓ **Replication manual** on transfer methodologies

 - ✓ **Mid term community event** in Barcelona on 13-14/11/2018

- ✓ Proposes to transform high congested roads through a 4 pillars approach:
 1. **Governance** pillar: new participative governance model for roads of middle sized cities
 2. **Hard** pillar: small scale interventions
 3. **Soft** pillar: Integrated Modelling Tool (IMT) for low carbon mobility solutions assessment
 4. **Educational** pillar: awareness raising on sustainable mobility behaviour

- ✓ Aims at improving sustainable urban mobility planning through **innovative strategies for integrating students' transport demand** into urban development processes.

- ✓ **Action Plan for Sustainable University Mobility Plan**
 - ✓ **RoadMap for decision makers:** ready-to-use guide for decision makers
 - ✓ **ICT model for management and communication** to define the tools for planning, managing and monitoring sustainable mobility in the University campus

- ✓ Aims to **mitigate the impact of cruise ships related traffic** on cities improving the quality of life of inhabitants and passengers **through a larger use of innovative sustainable transport solutions**

LOCATIONS latest and upcoming activities

- ✓ Lisbon, Malaga, Ravenna, Trieste, Rijeka, Zadar and Dures finalized their **Low Carbon Transport Plans (LCTP)** – publication ongoing
 - ✓ **Catalogue of potential replicating measures** including more than 40 measures – available in 5 languages
 - ✓ **Replication process** will kick-off with a dedicated training

- ✓ Intends to **reduce negative impact of touristic flows on environment and traffic in seaside resorts areas** by elaborating mobility scenarios, documents on sustainable tourism mobility, using IT tools, introducing electrical and sharing mobility solutions and issuing sustainable tourism mobility handbook

MOBILITAS upcoming activities

- ✓ **9 pilot projects will be tested** (IT solutions, sharing mobility solutions, electric vehicles and electrical charging stations)
 - ✓ **Transferability handbook** on sustainable tourism mobility to be completed by the end of the year

- ✓ Will **increase the planning capacities** on sustainable mobility of **port cities** through sharing of experiences, pilot actions and training activities. It will enable participating port cities to draft or update their SUMP, as long-term strategy documents for the future development of the city that can effectively address transport issues.

SUPPORT upcoming activities

- ✓ **Pilot actions** to be completed in all 6 participating MED port cities
 - ✓ **SUPPORT e-learning platform** featuring training materials, documents and studies to strengthen urban transport planning capacities
 - ✓ **Local transferring events** will be organized – no planning available yet
 - ✓ Last **SUMP training** to be organised in Barcelona on 14/11/2018
-

- ✓ Exploiting **social media and crowdsourcing** techniques to reinforce SUMP development in MED **cities with seasonal demand**. MOTIVATE project is promoting citizens' engagement to:
 - ✓ provide data for their daily trips
 - ✓ evaluate the current transport services, and
 - ✓ assess the usefulness of proposed/planned mobility interventions

MOTIVATE latest and upcoming activities

- ✓ **MOTIVATE app tested** in five pilot cities (Almada, Siena, Larnaka, Rhodes and Ioannina) - 2 000 trips registered so far
 - ✓ **Webinar** on the use of social media and crowdsourcing techniques in SUMP development – date TBC – open to external audience
